KATHERINE LANGHAM DIARY

1930-1942

Katherine Langham was an unmarried woman who lived next to the Methodist Church in Macon, Michigan. Her sister, Susan Langham, owned a house on Short Street behind the Macon Store. Henry Ford bought Susan's house.

Kate Langham's diary covers the years 1930-1942, approximately, and contains much detail on the activities in Macon by the Ford Motor Company and Henry Ford. There are items concerning the Ford Co-op, records of people moving and men being reassigned jobs, visits of Henry Ford, building of Macon Chapel, renovation of houses, dismantling of the Wm. Richard Wagon Shop, and activities of the Macon Schools.

Many of Henry Ford's men are mentioned, i.e., Charles Newton, Mr. King, Earl Pennington, Edgar Clark and Harold L. Khuler.

Katherine Langham died in 1945 at the age of 70.
