ABSTRACT: The Leab Kyes Family Scrapbook Collection, 1909-2009, contains 46 scrapbooks documenting a family's travels throughout the United States and Europe, mainly Germany, Switzerland, and England, from 1961-2007, as well as an oral history interview with Daniel J. Leab.

BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL NOTE

Leo Liebeskind (1897-1979) and Herta Marcus (1901-1981) met in Germany. In 1922, Herta began working for the Scherk cosmetics company, which was owned by one of her uncles. Working there until 1938, she rose through the ranks and became one of the top executives. It was there that Herta Marcus met Leo Liebeskind, who was working as a salesman for the company. They married in 1929, and seven years later, had a son named Daniel Joseph. The young family emigrated to the United States in 1938, where they changed their last name to Leab. In the late 1930s, Herta Leab started her own cosmetics company, named Hedda Maar Cosmetics. The company, which produced skin creams, perfume, and lipstick, were sold directly to customers in addition to being carried in retail stores. It was eventually sold in 1972.

Roger M. Kyes (1906-1971) and Helen Gilmore Jacoby (1904-2003) married in 1931, and had four children: Carolyn, Frances, Katharine, and Cynthia. Roger worked in business, starting out as an assistant to the president of the Glenn L. Martin Company from 1928-1930. He moved on to the Black & Decker Mfg. Co., then in 1932, became the Vice President of the Empire Plow Company, which supplied implements to the Ferguson Company. In 1940, Harry Ferguson persuaded Roger Kyes to join Ferguson and move to Dearborn, Michigan. Kyes stayed with Ferguson until 1947, when he moved to General Motors, eventually working in the transit bus division. Roger Kyes served as the United States Deputy Secretary of Defense from February 1953-May 1954, then returned to General Motors where he became an Executive Vice President in 1965. He left GM in 1969 to become the CEO of the American Steamship Company, and in 1971, a General Partner of Lazard Freres.

Daniel J. Leab (1936-2016) and Katharine Kyes (1941-2020) met while studying at Columbia University, where both were pursuing graduate studies. They married in 1964, while Daniel earned his PhD in history in 1969. The couple had three children: Abigail, Constance, and Marcus. Daniel taught at Columbia University and Seton Hall University, where he taught 20th Century history for over three decades. In 1972, Katharine and Daniel took ownership of *American Book Prices Current*, which recorded auction sales of books, manuscripts, autographs, maps, and broadsides. Katharine served as co-owner and editor-in-chief for more than four decades.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The Leab Kyes Family Scrapbook Collection, 1909-2009, contains 46 scrapbooks and an oral history interview on compact discs that document the travels of the Leab and Kyes families from 1961 to 2007. These scrapbooks contain photographic prints, including family images from before 1961, in addition to travel ephemera such as maps, menus, programs, postcards, and passports. Materials relating to Daniel Leab’s professional activities, such as seminars and conferences, are also included, as are items documenting work for *American Book Prices Current*. Of note, the scrapbooks document trips on the *SS France*, the Berlin Wall in 1963, the 1972 Thanksgiving Day Parade in New York City, Expo 67 in Montreal, and flights on the Concorde between the United States and Europe.

The scrapbooks are arranged roughly in chronological order, as a few contain trips that occurred in multiple years.
